St. Louis - Stuttgart Sister Cities Organization

Representatives from St. Louis, Missouri, USA and from Stuttgart, capital of the state of Baden-Württemberg, Germany, met on March 10, 1960 to sign official documents uniting the two cities in a sister city relationship and committing each to ongoing activities which encourage people-to-people and government-to-government interaction. The affiliation was formed under the guidelines of Sister Cities International, Inc., an organization founded by former U.S. President Dwight D. Eisenhower to promote world peace through mutual understanding. St. Louis-Stuttgart Sister Cities, Inc., a non-profit organization of volunteers, was founded in St. Louis to maintain communication with the director of sister programs in Stuttgart and to manage the activities that achieve the goals set forth in the partnership agreement.

Blazing New Trails

The sister city alliance with Stuttgart was the first for St. Louis and has been followed by a succession of ties with cities in Africa, Asia, Europe and South America. The linking of cities is based on similarities that offer opportunities for exchange. St. Louis and Stuttgart share corresponding characteristics and resources: both are rich in educational and cultural institutions. The two cities have drawn from all of these sectors for forty-six years, lending and borrowing ideas, personnel and resources to build a rich and strong association.
